Don't forget to claim your age-related benefits

Our records show that you will soon be turning 60. You may have thousands of dollars in benefits waiting for you to claim.

As with most things, there is some paperwork involved. Depending on the benefit, the application process could take several weeks to complete. It's a good idea to start applying early. Don't worry, if you have questions or need help, support is available (see bottom of page 3 for more information).

<u>Low Income Seniors benefit</u> (Age 60+)

To qualify, you must be receiving at least one of the following federal benefits:

- Guaranteed Income Supplement
- Allowance for Survivor Program
- Allowance Program (between 60 and 64 years old)

\$400.00 / year

If both spouses/common-law partners live in the same household, only **one \$400.00** benefit will be granted.

If spouses live separately (for example, one residing in a nursing home), both will be eligible for the benefit.

Apply online yearly.
Applications open on April 1st.

To apply by paper, <u>download</u> the application.

POTENTIAL AMOUNT

\$1,339 + \$CPP / Month (amount varies depending on income + eligibility).

If you have worked and have a disability, you may qualify for the following:

Canada Pension Plan Disability Benefits (Age 60-64)

Minimum basic payment amount is \$558.74 / month <u>plus</u> additional money depending on how much and for how long you paid into the CPP. Maximum payment \$1,538.67/month.

When you turn 65 your CPP disability benefit is automatically changed to a <u>CPP retirement</u> <u>pension</u>.

- Apply online using your <u>My Service Canada</u> Account (MSCA).
- To apply by paper, download the application.

POTENTIAL AMOUNT

\$ 558.74 – 1,538.67 / month (amount varies depending on CPP contribution).

If your spouse or common-law partner has passed away, you may qualify for the following:

Canada Pension Plan Survivor's Pension (Under the age of 65)

A monthly payment paid to the legal spouse or common-law partner of the deceased contributor.

If you are not receiving other CPP benefits, you will receive a flat rate portion **and 37.5%** of the contributor's CPP.

If you already receive a Canada Pension Plan (CPP) retirement pension or disability pension, the survivor's pension will be combined into a single monthly payment.

- Apply online using your <u>My Service Canada</u> Account (MSCA).
- To apply by paper, download the application.
